NEW WORLD DAY OF PRAYER ANNOUNCED

Pope Francis has decided to set up a "World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation" which will be celebrated on September 1st annually. In his letter of announcement, Francis states: The annual World Day of prayer for the Care of Creation offers to individual believers and to the community a precious opportunity to renew our personal participation in this vocation as custodians of creation, raising to God our thanks for the marvelous works that He has entrusted to our care, invoking his help for the protection of creation and his mercy for the sins committed against the world in which we live. The celebration of the Day on the same date as the Orthodox Church will be a valuable opportunity to bear witness to our growing communion with our orthodox brothers. We live in a time where all Christians are faced with identical and important challenges and we must give common replies to these in order to appear more credible and effective. Therefore it is my hope that this Day can involve, in some way, other Churches and ecclesial Communities and be celebrated in union with the initiatives that the World Council of Churches is promoting on this issue.

How can we transmit a living, personal Catholic faith to future generations? By coming to know Jesus Christ, and following him as his disciples.

These are times of immense challenge and immense opportunity for the Catholic Church.

Consider these statistics for the United States.

- Only 30 percent of Americans who were raised Catholic are still practicing.
- Fully 10 percent of all adults in America are ex-Catholics.
- The number of marriages celebrated in the Church decreased dramatically, by nearly 60 percent, between 1972 and 2010.
- Only 60 percent of Catholics believe in a personal God.

If the Church is to reverse these trends, the evangelizers must first be evangelized.

In other words, Catholics-in-the-pew must make a conscious choice to know and follow Jesus before they can draw others to him. Sherry Weddell leads participants through steps that will help Catholics enter more deeply into a relationship with God and the river of apostolic creativity, charisms, and vocation that flow from that relationship for the sake of the Church and the world.

Learn about the five thresholds of postmodern conversion, how to open a conversation about faith and belief, how to ask thought-provoking questions and establish an atmosphere of trust, when to tell the Great Story of Jesus, how to help someone respond to God's call to intentional discipleship, and much more.

Be prepared for conversion because when life at the parish level changes, the life of the whole Church will change.

World Meeting of Families -Philadelphia, Sept. 22-25, 2015

What is this? Held every three years and sponsored by the Holy See's Pontifical Council for the Family, the World Meeting of Families is the world's largest Catholic gathering of families. Each World Meeting of Families has a theme that energizes and enlivens the event while adding great depth of meaning to our understanding of families. The theme of the World Meeting of Families – Philadelphia 2015 is "Love Is Our Mission: The Family Fully Alive," emphasizing the impact of the love and life of families on our society. What happens at it? The Congress is a huge gathering to pray for families and marriages and to learn about them from the Catholic Church's perspective. It is international and about 15,000 people are expected to attend from all

over the world. There will be liturgies, keynote speakers and break-out sessions throughout the 4 days. Because this is for families, children are welcome: children ages 6-17 are invited to the Youth Congress happening simultaneously with the Adult Congress and childcare is available for children 6 months-12 years.

Can I come for a day? Yes, you can register for the whole conference or for parts of it.

Will Pope Francis be in attendance? No, but his visit to the USA was planned in conjunction with it and he will be in Philadelphia for an open air family celebration and mass the Saturday and Sunday after the World Meeting of Families (Sept 26-27)
