

Deadline for the Diocesan Pilgrimage to the Basilica of the National Shrine

We have extended to August 31st the deadline to receive names of parish participants and one check for all parish participants. However, we do need to know ASAP if parishes are working on participating - so that we can retain an adequate number of busses.

Parishes can reserve a whole bus, departing from your parish site, for \$2750 -- then you would enlist the 50-55 passengers and collect the fee of \$55 per person. IF your parish is arranging and paying for your own bus, we would ask only a \$5 per person fee to cover the other costs of participating in the pilgrimage. IF you have a smaller group of pilgrims, just let us know your plans and we will plan them into a combined but departing somewhere near you. Registration includes cabin lodging, delicious home cooked meals, a t-shirt and unforgettable memories!


