

Rite of Election

The Rite of Election will be celebrated by Bishop Bambera on Sunday, February 18 at 2:30PM (please note the change in time from previous years). This ritual marks the beginning of a period of intense preparation for those catechumens anticipating the Sacraments of Initiation at Easter. During the liturgy, the Church judges the catechumens' readiness and then the catechumens enroll their names as a pledge of fidelity to this call. The bishop then declares their "election" or admission to receive the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil. Candidates (those already baptized) are also invited to attend this liturgy as they participate in the Call to Continuing Conversion. The RCIA Coordinator Information and Enrollment forms are now available on the diocesan website under Christian Initiation Resources. Parishes with new RCIA Coordinators are asked to contact Nancy Valtos at the Office for Parish Life and provide their new contact information.

Lent & Easter Liturgical Resource


