Details and Registration open at: www.dioceseofscranton.org At the conclusion of the Extraordinary Synod last October, Pope Francis decided to make public the *Relatio Synodi*, the document which summarized the synod's work. At the same time, the Holy Father indicated that this document would be the *Lineamenta*, or outline, for the XIV Ordinary General Assembly to take place from October 4-25, 2015, to treat the topic, "*The Vocation and Mission of the Family in the Church and the Contemporary World*."

As the report states: These proposed reflections, the fruit of the synodal work that took place in great freedom and with a spirit of reciprocal listening, are intended to raise questions and indicate points of view that will later be developed and clarified through reflection in the local Churches in the intervening year leading to the XIV Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops. (*Relatio Synodi, #*62)

With this in mind, we have "one year to mature, with true spiritual discernment, the proposed ideas and to find concrete solutions to so many difficulties and innumerable challenges families must confront" (Pope Francis, *Concluding Discourse*, October 18, 2014).





Presenter: Katherine Coolidge is the Called & Gifted Coordinator for Catherine of Siena Institute. She brings experience as a pastoral leader in RCIA, youth ministry, adult faith formation, lay ministry formation, evangelization, and, mostly recently, pastoral associate in a southern California parish. Her passion is helping parish leadership create a parish climate in which disciples are called, formed, equipped and sent in the service of Christ's mission in the world. She is a recognized master catechist in California and earned a Masters in Pastoral Studies from St. Joseph College of Maine. She contributed to the new book, *Becoming a Parish of Intentional Disciples*, as well as weekly to the blog, <u>Love Is Calling Ministries</u>. Katherine is married to Michael for thirty-five years; together they have four young adult children and four grandchildren.



The Catherine of Siena Institute, founded by Sherry Weddell, author of *Forming Intentional Disciples*, is an affiliated ministry of the Western Dominican Province dedicated to equipping parishes for the evangelization and formation of lay Catholics for the sake of their mission in the world.

Details on the February 2015 Opportunities

1. National Marriage Week, Feb 7-14, & World Marriage Sunday, February 15

What is this about? The annual observance of National Marriage Week encourages diverse groups to strengthen individual marriages, reduce the divorce rate, and build a stronger marriage culture, which in turn helps curtail poverty and benefits children.

What can I do to help married couples in my parish? Give them ways to reflect on and strengthen their marriages:

• Make them aware of some of the great resources available to them!

For Your Marriage, which is sponsored by the USCCB is a TERRIFIC website for dating, engaged and married couples. You could direct couples to this page or print some of their articles in your bulletin. Here are some examples:

Give a little boost with a Daily Marriage Tip

Send them on a <u>7-day virtual marriage retreat</u>!

Suggest some weekly dating ideas

Host Six Dates for Married Couples

- Host a Valentine Café: Set up a little café with tables for 2 in your parish hall. Put some Hershey's kisses and 2-3 discussion starters on each table so couples can sit and talk for 10-15 minutes about some aspect of their married life. Like...
 - 1. Describe how you met your spouse. When did you realize he/she was really special and what was it you noticed?
 - 2. What qualities are you most grateful for in your spouse? Why?
 - 3. When have you felt like you and your spouse make a great team?
- Ask all the married couples to stand during mass and bless them. Do the same with engaged couples.
- Have cookies/donuts and punch after mass to celebrate the great vocation of marriage and how it is a pillar of your parish community.
- Offer couples the option of renewing their vows at the weekend liturgy.
- Include one or more prayers in the Prayers of the Faithful that celebrates the faithfulness of married couples and asks for fortitude. There are all kinds of couples to pray for!

2. World Day of Prayer for the Sick, Feb. 11

The <u>National Association of Catholic Chaplains</u> has developed resources to help with the planning and celebration of World Day of the Sick (coinciding with the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes). The resources include suggestions and prayers for use by individuals as well as parishes and health care institutions.

- Share a family prayer service with someone who is sick in your family.
- Offer some kind of support or relief to a family member who is caring for someone who is sick.
- Affirm the healthcare providers who serve your family.

3. Helping Families Choose Life, Part 2: Channeling the Energy of Your Pre-Schooler

What is this about? This is the second brief video in a series teaching parenting skills. Produced in collaboration with Catholic Social Services, it features Jennifer Barber and Shaliya Jones. They explain what is developmentally appropriate for 3-5 year olds and how you can help your child progress in a healthy direction. The presenters encourage appropriate safety parameters, taking time daily for interaction and bonding with your child and discipline based on routines and praise.

What can I do with this to help parents in my parish? Some options include:

- Get the word out in the bulletin, parish webpage/Facebook page or newsletter for Pre-K or Kindergarten parents-- that this is available for viewing privately. Viewing links are listed below.
- Invite parents of tots and pre-schoolers for an evening/weekend/afternoon for reflection. Show the video and discuss. Use a
 prayer/reflective activity from <u>www.vibrantfaith@home.org</u>.
- Show this to your parish Moms-and-Tots or Mommy-and-Me group and discuss. Use a prayer/ reflective activity from <u>www.vibrantfaith@home.org</u>.

What is this? Catechesis for all members of the family that focuses on Lent, adapted from the Diocese of Greensburg, PA


