Leaders from several parishes throughout the Diocese of Scranton will be coming together at the end of January to hold trainings for *ARISE* Season Four: *New Heart, New Spirit.* This season of the small group faith-sharing process—spanning the weeks of Lent—will address the need for reconciliation and healing in our lives, in parishes and throughout the world. These training sessions are being offered to



assist parish leaders in their understanding of grief, forgiveness, healing, and to provide ways to create an environment for healing in faith communities. This upcoming Lenten season is also an opportunity for interested parishes to discern starting participation in the *ARISE Together in Christ* process for Fall 2017; *ARISE* gives parishioners a framework within which to respond to the invitation to grow in faith through weekly reflections on Scripture, sharing how the Word of God relates to daily life, and cultivating active discipleship through Christian social action. Participants journey deeper into their faith during each of the five seasons. 

Rethinking Marriage Preparation

Do you ever wonder if your marriage preparation program is as effective as it could be? Authors Diana Macalintal and Nick Wagner suggest that we need to shift from simply preparing engaged couples for marriage and instead invite them into a discipleship which will sustain them long after the wedding day. Macalintal and Wagner have developed a way to use the RCIA model for marriage preparation. The process connects the couple into the parish community

as well as evangelizes everyone.

Sounds intriguing but what would it look like? "Tending to Self"


February 11th from 9AM-4PM at the Diocesan Pastoral Center, 330 Wyoming Ave, Scranton

10 Ways to "nurture parish members in the stewardship of their gifts"

Editor's Note: The 2017 Office for Parish Life Calendar is available either by contacting the Office for copies, or site. Each month focuses on one of the consensus goal areas surfacing in parish pastoral plans across the Diocese. For each month of our Good *News Notes* this year, we will also include a column like the one here – corresponding to the goal area for each month on the calendar.

- Host a Living Your Strengths Retreat with Bernadette Rudolph, Director for Community and Family Development through the Office for Parish Life;
- 2. Include a gifts inventory instrument, matched to parish ministries, in your process of registering for the parish;
- Recruit for specific parish projects by naming the gifts and talents needed for each task in order to implement or accomplish the goal and to achieve the benefits for the parish;
- 4. Cultivate an "attitude of gratitude" in every parish program and activity reminding people that we give because we are blessed: "Freely have you received, freely give."
- 5. Form a stewardship team for all aspects of parish life – their goal is to foster engagement by calling forth peoples' investment of skills, talents, and financial support;
- Gather a group to participate in the VLCFF Course entitled "The Joy of the Gospel"

- Form mentoring partnerships between the "longtimers" who have sustained parish ministries and activities for decades, and young adult members or couples who may not yet have actively participated but whose leadership could be developed;
- 8. Identify a "reach project" something for which the parish feels called by its mission and which will require a significant contribution of time, talent and treasure over a year or more;
- Make a deliberate point to generously acknowledge volunteers and donors affirming their specific contributions and the ways these benefit the parish as a whole and build up the Kingdom of God.
- 10. Present the Diocesan Annual Appeal as an extension of the gifts of your parish reaching to needs beyond the scope of any one parish – and the benefits this also brings back to the vitality of your parish.
