

## RENEW Process Launching for Parish Engagement in Faith-Sharing Communities

In August and September, ten parishes across the Diocese will be preparing their small faith community facilitators for Renew International's process of adult faith formation and parish renewal. Renew Team professionals have been on site here in the Diocese of Scranton several times in recent months, providing initial information sessions, then parish team training.

Once the Facilitator Training is completed, each parish will invite their members to join a parish group for the first season of *ARISE: Together in Christ.* This first season focuses on what it means to seek and encounter Christ — and the weekly sessions will look at this question through the lens of each of the gospel writers, and then the writing of St. Paul.

# FORMING INTENTIONAL DISCIPLES: SHERRY WEDDELL SATURDAY, OCTOBER 24, 2015 ST. MONICA'S PARISH CENTER - WEST WYOMING, PA

How can we transmit a living, personal Catholic faith to future generations? By coming to know Jesus Christ, and following him as his disciples.

These are times of immense challenge and immense opportunity for the Catholic Church.


Consider these statistics for the United States.

- Only 30 percent of Americans who were raised Catholic are still practicing.
- Fully 10 percent of all adults in America are ex-Catholics.
- The number of marriages celebrated in the Church decreased dramatically, by nearly 60 percent, between 1972 and 2010.
- Only 60 percent of Catholics believe in a personal God.

If the Church is to reverse these trends, the evangelizers must first be evangelized. In other words, Catholics-in-the-pew must make a conscious choice to know and follow Jesus before they can draw others to him. Sherry Weddell leads participants through steps that will help Catholics enter more deeply into a relationship with God and the river of apostolic creativity, charisms, and vocation that flow from that relationship for the sake of the Church and the world.

Learn about the five thresholds of postmodern conversion, how to open a conversation about faith and belief, how to ask thought-provoking questions and establish an atmosphere of trust, when to tell the Great Story of Jesus, how to help someone respond to God's call to intentional discipleship, and much more.

Be prepared for conversion because when life at the parish level changes, the life of the whole Church will change.
