National Natural Family Planning Awareness Week July 23-29, 2017

The Catholic Church in the United States will celebrate National NFP Awareness Week beginning July 23. This year's theme is *It's Time! Say "Yes" to God's Plan for Married Love*. The purpose of the week is to "celebrate and reverence God's vision of human sexuality."

The Catholic Church teaches that Natural Family Planning is a morally acceptable way for married couples to balance their constant openness to the procreative purpose of sex within marriage and their responsibility to bring into the world children they can responsibly nurture. NFP allows a couple to work with the woman's fertility cycle, rather than see it as an obstacle. Furthermore, NFP encourages the married couple to develop a level of intimacy that includes and goes beyond intercourse.

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops offers a number of resources for parishes to promote NFP awareness during NFP Awareness Week on the USCCB website, <u>www.usccb.org</u>. Regional SERVICE Gatherings

OPL's Service and Social Concerns held four Regional Gatherings last month in Lords Valley, Muncy, Throop, and Wilkes-Barre.

About 100 folks from about 20 parishes participated in this two-hour workshop which focused on supporting our parishes' Social Concerns efforts and encouraging our worshiping communities to break open our Bishops' 1993 document: "Building Communities of Salt and Light" found HERE!

This challenge from our Bishops calls us to consider building up a vibrant Parish Social Ministry that includes not only the works of CHARITY but also the work of JUSTICE and PEACE-MAKING – all with a reminder that we are part of a global Church!

- 1. Form and train a well-rounded Parish Liturgical Commission, spending quality time together to anticipate and facilitate the full liturgical cycle in all aspects of parish life;
- 2. Position parish leaders at each weekend liturgy with an "observation checklist" have them take note of the experience from different spots, evaluating the sense of welcome, engagement, sound, sightlines, etc.;
- 3. Heighten the value placed on "full, conscious and active" participation by every member of your parish assembly — What are all the possible ways people are invited to express themselves? Who is still on the margins and how can that be changed?
- 4. Every weekend when the community assembles, make sure something about the gathering connects with local life, and that something about the gathering will go out the door with each family;
- 5. Invest in quality music ministry—check with David Baloga, Director for Worship for guidance in planning, in selecting and training music ministry leaders, and in en-

gaging the assembly in all dimensions of liturgy.

- 6. Regularly review how the liturgy of your parish interfaces with the faith formation, the service and social justice efforts, and the needs of all families or households;
- Utilize the Liturgical Ministry training resource provided through the Office for Parish Life (let us know if you still need this tool);
- 8. Gather a diverse group of parishioners to study the Scriptures of each season and formulate themes for preaching and faithsharing;
- Invite a group from your parish to participate in the VLCFF online course entitled "Introduction to Liturgy" and/or the great webinars provided through LTP (Liturgy, Training Publications);
- 10. Consider every inch of your parish physical space and its capacity to enhance the experience of liturgy — How does it visually call us to pray? Set the tone for this liturgical season? Contribute to a sense of welcome and inclusion? Is there anything in the space which is not meaningful or intentional?
