## WORLD REFUGEE DAY

A "World Refugee Day" Celebration Sunday, June 26, 2016 from 1:00PM to 4:00PM Nay Aug Park, Scranton PA (*Mulberry Street Entrance*)

Sponsored by: Catholic Social Services and the Office for Parish Life of the Diocese of Scranton

World Refugee Day, observed on June 20, was established by the United Nations Refugee Agency (UNHCR) to commemorate the strength, courage and resilience of millions of refugees throughout the world. In recognition of this special day, all are invited to celebrate the rich cultural heritage of the refugee communities in Northeastern PA.

The celebration will include cultural music, dance, art, an "ethnic dress" fashion show, crafts and games for children, resources from community partners, and exhibits from refugee families. Ice cream will be available, and attendees can bring a picnic.

In addition, community members of all ages who attend the celebration are invited to participate in The International Interdependence Hexagon Project, a non-profit visual arts opportunity for schools and community groups worldwide.

Thinking about the positive aspects of different cultures and the commonalities that bind us as members of a global community, the Hexagon Project asks us to celebrate these commonalities and respect differences in an increasingly interdependent world. At the World Refugee Day celebration, community members of all ages will be able to create hexagons, using different art materials, based on what they experience through observing and meeting people from the various countries represented.

If they choose, participants' hexagons may become part of an exhibit at the Market-place at Steamtown (formerly The Mall at Steamtown) opening on First Friday, September 2, running through September 30. #### Revised Order of Celebrating Matrimony Workshops

The revised *Order of Celebrating Matrimony* has been approved and publication is expected soon. The workshops are intended for priests, deacons, parish musicians, and diocesan leaders who actively prepare couples for marriage and for the celebration of Matrimony. The cost is \$55.



The day-long workshops will combine the very best of liturgical theology and pastoral practice and will cover such topics as: What's new in the second edition?; What has stayed the same?; The Theology of Marriage; Duties and Ministries in the Rite; Pastoral Preparation of Engaged Couples and more. 
