"It is essential that forms of the liturgy be completely accessible to people with disabilities, since these forms are the essence of the spiritual tie that binds the Christian community together... Realistic provision must be made for persons with disabilities to participate fully in the Eucharist and other liturgical celebrations." (*Pastoral Statement of U.S. Catholic Bishops on People with Disabilities*, 1978, #23)

- Include a prayer of the faithful regarding disabilities on the Feast of Corpus Christi.

10 Ways to "expand social ministry and to reflect the whole of Catholic Social Teaching"

- 1. Invite your Social Concerns groups and/or Parish Councils to study the document <u>Building Communities of Salt and Light</u> from our US Bishops—a roadmap to build a full and vibrant Parish Social Ministry that encourages across-the-board parish involvement in our Church's works of charity, justice, and peacemaking.
- 2. Gather parish groups of all kinds to watch and discuss *In the Footsteps of Jesus* a two-part DVD exploring the 7 Principles of Catholic Social Teaching and how these are an invitation to walk in the footsteps of Jesus through our Parish Social Ministries. Consider showing this as part of the homily. Order the \$15 DVD here.
- 3. Consider a 4 week Advent journey or a 6 week Lenten journey: "Following the nonviolent Jesus" which will explore successful nonviolent movements—some involving the Catholic Church—as well as the recently formed <u>Catholic Nonviolence Initiative</u>, and a session on <u>Pope Francis' 50th Anniversary World Day of Peace message</u>. Contact Richard DeBona for more information.
- 4. Invite various members/groups of your worshiping community to walk with both feet of Christian Service, charity AND justice, by leading them through these resources: <u>Two Feet of Service: charity and justice</u>, <u>quotes</u> <u>on charity and justice</u>, and a 22-minute <u>video</u> from Catholic Charities in Minnesota.
- 5. Start an Environmental Ministry at your parish by partnering with "Catholic Climate Covenant." Check out their website in order to learn more about celebrating and protecting God's Creation:

- 6. Connect with Catholic Relief Services to better understand the Catholic Social Teaching principle of solidarity. One simple step: serve Fair Trade coffee at your Coffee and Donuts after Masses which can be ordered on the <u>CRS eithcial trade website</u>. Additionally, when your parish participates in the CRS Rice Bowls, ask your catechists to introduce the <u>CRS Educational Guides</u> into their classrooms.
- 7. Attend a conference or two, such as: The Catholic Social Ministry Gathering in Washington, DC next February, or the Pennsylvania Interfaith Power and Light conference. Read about 2016 conference here and plan for Fall 2017.
- 8. Go to these Catholic websites and sign up to receive ADVOCACY ACTION ALERTS on many and varied issues: <u>Catholic Relief Services advocacy</u>; <u>Pennsylvania</u> <u>Catholic Conference advocacy</u>; <u>USA Bishops advocacy</u>
- 9. Prayerfully consider organizing local, national and international Mission trips based on the 4 cornerstones of prayer, simple living, community living, and service that includes charity AND justice! Contact the Office for Parish Life for immediate assistance, even for this coming summer.
- 10. Consider enrolling in our Lay Ministry Formation for Servant Leadership with a focus on Social Concerns.
