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April 2015 Opportunities: Love Is Our Mission: The Family Fully Alive

1. Family-oriented Mystagogy

What is this about? Mystagogy, the final phase in the RCIA process, is a period of reflection on the mysteries of God's grace changing us in the initiation process. While most parishioners don't go through RCIA/RCIC, they all receive sacraments of initiation and spring is filled with them! Gather families to reflect on how they continue to be saved by Jesus and grow spiritually after the ceremonies are done.

Who is invited? Anyone who has received any of the three sacraments of initiation and their families

What does it look like? Families bring photos from and a gift received for the sacramental event to a parish gathering. In the context of prayer, they share memories of the day and reflect on what was significant for them about the day as well as how it has changed them personally and in their family life. A meal or light refreshments are shared for fellowship.

2. Helping Families Choose Life, Part 4: Communication Essentials for You and Your Teen

What is this about? This is the fourth brief video in a series teaching parenting skills. Produced in collaboration with Catholic Social Services, it presents counselors Andrew Ball and Jolette Lyons who explain how good communication with your teen is the cornerstone to a good relationship. While a teen becomes increasingly independent, he/she needs you to be a safe launching pad. Andy and Jolette show that everyday communication enables you to be that safe base for your teen. They give tips on communicating well and ways to use technology and social media wisely.

What can I do with this to help parents in my parish? Some options include:

Get the word out – in the bulletin, parish webpage/Facebook page or newsletter for Youth Group, CCD/Religious Ed or the Catholi school-- that this is available for viewing privately. Viewing links are listed below.

Invite parents of teens (middle school or high school) for an evening/weekend/afternoon of reflection. Show the video and discuss. Use a prayer/reflective activity from www.vibrantfaithathome.org.

Show this to parents while their teens are attending youth group/religious education classes and discuss. Use a prayer/reflective activity from www.vibrantfaithathome.org. Include this video as part of a parent meeting for Confirmation preparation.

What is this? Catechesis for all members of the family that focuses on Lent, adapted from the Diocese of Greensburg, PA How can I use it with families in my parish?
