Pastors, members of your Pastoral and Finance Councils, and additional parish leaders in ministries of Word, Worship, Service and Community are invited to come together to learn about and discuss strategies for healthy and creative ways to develop or strengthen your linked parish relationship. This is intended for those parishes who are very experienced as a linkage and for those just beginning this model of pastoral leadership.

Facilitator for the day, **Mark Mogilka**, has served Catholic leaders for almost forty years through diocesan ministries in La Crosse, WI, Columbus, OH and for the past twenty-seven years, Green Bay, WI as the director of Stewardship and Pastoral Services. Mark is a frequent speaker at leadership workshops, conferences and seminaries throughout the US and Canada. He has made presentations and published articles on multi-parish ministry, pastoral planning, leadership, parish councils, building vibrant parishes and stewardship. Mark chaired the Emerging Models of Pastoral Leadership Project on Multiple Parish Ministry and co-author a book entitled "Multiple Parish Pastoring." Mark has advanced degrees in Social Work from the University of Wisconsin, Madison and Religious Studies from the University of Detroit.


