# SUMMER MISSION EXPERIENCE

The Pontifical Mission Societies, through the Office for Parish Life, is coordinating a Summer Mission Experience for high school Juniors in our Diocese which will take place from July 13 to July 19, 2014. This is a faith-based mission journey which will involve learning, service, and interaction among children, youth and adults at various mission sites in the rural area of Tioga and Bradford Counties. Some of the activities during the week will include a Vacation Bible School as well as other church and community projects and activities. The group's home base will be at St. Peter's Parish Hall in Wellsboro. Fr. Jeff Walsh, pastor of St. John's Church in East Stroudsburg, and Fr. Greg Reichlen, assistant pastor at St. John the Evangelist Parish in Honesdale, will serve as the group's spiritual directors.



Other chaperones include four Diocesan Seminarians as well as Miriam Heverline, Education Coordinator for the Pontifical Mission Societies and Gail Fromm, Pastoral Associate at Our Lady of Snows in Clarks Summit. Students from around the Diocese have already participated in a weekend Retreat at Fatima Center and are set to meet to begin more immediate preparations on May 4.
