Elaine is perhaps best known as the editor of *Today's Liturgy*, the quarterly liturgy preparation magazine from OCP. She has been writing the weekly columns and music suggestions in *Today's Liturgy* for more than 30 years, offering practical wisdom to generations of pastoral musicians.

Elaine leads events around the country, working with parishes and dioceses to focus on the preparation of ministers and selecting the music for the liturgy.


Lay Ministry Formation Informational Session

Event for Those Involved in Marriage Ministries in the Diocese of Scranton










Save the Date

October 14th will mark the canonization of two very important saints. Paul VI was pope during the second half of Vatican II. He helped to implement the many reforms of the Council and also affirmed the Church's stance on the dignity of human life in *Humanae Vitae*, which will celebrate its 50th Anniversary this year.

Oscar Romero, the famous Archbishop of El Salvador, will also be canonized on this date next month. Romero was outspoken against violent political and governmental forces in his country and was killed while saying mass in the spring of 1980. Romero is remembered and venerated for his commitment to the poor and for his firm stance against violence and political corruption.





Stay tuned for upcoming events from the Office for Parish Life celebrating these two saints and their commitment to service. Specifically, we hope to host an event for youth and young adults to honor Romero and discuss the universal call to holiness during the week of October $14^{\rm th}$.

September Green Tips:

- As we move into fall, check your air conditioning system to make sure that you are not using more energy than you should be.
 Also, try to avoid AC—instead, open windows wherever possible!
 You will get to enjoy the fresh air and save on electricity.
- Recycling is good, but reducing is much better. When you are thinking about buying something, try the 30-Day Rule -- wait 30 days after the first time you decide you want a product to really make your decision. This will eliminate impulse buying.
- Engage your parish by starting a wash and dry team. Instead of using paper and plastic dinnerware for parish events, go to your local thrift store and buy reusable ones. Then, start a volunteer team to wash and dry them after each event. Your parish will reduce its paper and plastic waste.
