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

It is also one way to complete the pre-requisites for the Diocesan Certificate in Lay Ministry.

#### Rite of Election

The Rite of Election will be celebrated by Bishop Bambera on Sunday, March 10 at 2:30PM (please note the change in time from previous years). This ritual marks the beginning of a period of intense preparation for those catechumens anticipating the Sacraments of Initiation at Easter.



During the liturgy, the Church judges the catechumens' readiness and then the catechumens enroll their names as a pledge of fidelity to this call. The bishop then declares their "election" or admission to receive the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil. Candidates (those already baptized) are also invited to attend this liturgy as they participate in the Call to Continuing Conversion.

The RCIA Coordinator Information and Enrollment forms are now available on the diocesan website under Parish Life/Christian Initiation. Parishes with new RCIA Coordinators are asked to contact Nancy Valtos at the Office for Parish Life and provide their new contact information.



# Lenten Resources for Ongoing Atonement and Healing in the Church

E ach parish in the Diocese of Scranton is encouraged to pray continuously for atonement and healing for victims of sexual abuse, especially during the Lenten season and during the month of April which is "National Child Abuse Prevention Month." The diocesan website has several resources for parishes to offer prayers for victims of sexual abuse that include:

- ♦ A rosary for Atonement and Healing using the Sorrowful Mysteries
- ◆ **Day of Atonement and Healing**—Family Participation Ideas for Home and Church
- ♦ Intercessions for the Universal Prayer
- Prayer Booklet for Atonement and Healing—for individuals or small groups
- Pieta Prayer Card (in English and Spanish)
- Prayer Resources from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops—includes a sample prayer service, a rosary for Healing and Protection of the Vulnerable among us, litany for healing, sample intercessions and songs
- Liturgical Resources from the Federation of Diocesan Liturgical Commissions—suggested Mass preparations, sample Word service within Eucharistic Adoration, sample intercessions, psalmody, hymnody, and talking points

Look for additional resources for Lent in mid-February including **new** *The Light is ON for You* **resources** and a **Stations of the Cross booklet** focused on healing in the Church.

During the season of Lent, parishes are also asked to **set aside one Sunday Mass intention** for the victims of sexual abuse by clergy in our diocese.

Parishes are also invited to burn a **candle before an image of the Blessed Virgin Mary** during the season of Lent as a reminder of Our Lady's intercession and of our constant prayers for those victims of abuse.
