The workshop will include practical ideas and starting points within these topics and explore the ministry implications for youth ministry, catechesis, sacramental preparation, and parish life. It is designed for all parish leaders whose ministries touch the lives of adolescents – including pastors, parish life coordinators, deacons, pastoral associates, coordinators of youth ministry, leaders in faith formation and catechists, Confirmation preparation leaders, Catholic School teachers and service/social concerns leaders. 
Echoes of Faith Information Night

Created by the National Conference for Catechetical Leadership (NCCL) and published by RCL Benziger, Echoes of Faith is an online education program offering basic adult formation in the Catholic Faith. With fourteen modules divided into three categories, the Echoes of Faith Learning Center can be used for parish Adult Faith Formation and for Basic Catechist Certification. During the 2016 United States visit by Pope Francis, she was invited to lead the Spanish choir at a Mass to close the World Meeting of Families.



Lenten Resources for Ongoing Atonement and Healing in the Church

E ach parish in the Diocese of Scranton is encouraged to pray continuously for atonement and healing for victims of sexual abuse, especially during the Lenten season and during the month of April which is "National Child Abuse Prevention Month." The diocesan website has several resources for parishes to offer prayers for victims of sexual abuse that include:

- Stations of the Cross Booklet for Atonement and Healing
- ♦ The Light Is ON for You resources focused on Healing in the Church
- Intercessions for the Universal Prayer
- Pieta Prayer Card (in English and Spanish)
- ♦ A Rosary for Atonement and Healing using the Sorrowful Mysteries
- ◆ Day of Atonement and Healing—Family Participation Ideas for Home and Church
- Prayer Booklet for Atonement and Healing—for individuals or small groups
- Prayer Resources from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops—includes a sample prayer service, a rosary for Healing and Protection of the Vulnerable among us, litany for healing, sample intercessions and songs
- ♦ Liturgical Resources from the Federation of Diocesan Liturgical Commissions—suggested Mass preparations, sample Word service within Eucharistic Adoration, sample intercessions, psalmody, hymnody, and talking points

During the season of Lent, parishes are also asked to set aside one Sunday Mass intention on the Fifth Sunday of Lent for the victims of sexual abuse by clergy in our diocese.

Parishes are also invited to burn a **candle before an image of the Blessed Virgin Mary** during the season of Lent as a reminder of Our Lady's intercession and of our constant prayers for those victims of abuse.

Other group discussion resources are *The Wounded Body of Christ* by Matthew W. Halbach, Ph.D. (<u>Twenty-Third Publications</u>) and *Healing Our Church* by Jerome Herauf and Charles Paolino (<u>RENEW International</u>).
