Child Abuse Prevention Month

For several years the Diocese of Scranton has joined in the efforts to prevent child abuse by participating in special activities during the month of April. All parishes, schools and diocesan organizations are encouraged to implement an event/activity to support prevention. You are welcome to design a unique project to meet your needs. Parish resources for the healing and protection of children from abuse can be found on the <u>USCCB website</u>. The following suggestions are offered for your consideration:

- Celebrate a Mass for the intentions of victims/ survivors and the protection of youth. (See Sample Intercessions)
- Offer a rosary for the intentions of victims/survivors and the protection of youth.
- Dedicate the last Sunday of April to prayers for the prevention of abuse. This campaign has been called Blue Sunday. To register and obtain resources see www.bluesunday.org
- Include one or more of the bulletin inserts during the month of April.
- Add a prayer for healing during Mass or feature the prayer in the bulletin.
- Host a speaker to address a topic concerning child safety.
- Create or purchase blue ribbon pins to be distributed to parishioners at all Masses on a designated weekend. (Since 1989 the symbol of a blue ribbon has been utilized to create national awareness of the issue of child abuse. It was initiated by a Virginia grandmother named Bonnie Finney whose 3 year old grandson died after severe abuse by his mother's boyfriend.)
- Create a blue ribbon tree and display prominently with a sign indicating its significance.
- Participate in a fundraising campaign for an organization focusing on prevention. Collect a small donation from participants in your workplace who will wear blue ribbons and blue clothing on a designated day.
- Support healthy family relationships by hosting a movie, game night or other family-friendly event. Provide literature promoting positive family connections.

Relic of St. Jean Vianney

The incorrupt heart of St. Jean Vianney will be visiting the Cathedral of Saint Peter in Scranton on **Saturday, April 13, 2019**. The Shrine of Ars, France, has made this major relic available for a national tour in the United States.

The Knights of Columbus are hosting this tour and welcome this special opportunity to offer for veneration this



relic of the patron of parish priests, whose holiness and integrity is a model for clergy and laity alike.

The relic will be welcomed to the Cathedral of Saint Peter with Morning Prayer at 8:30 a.m. It will remain on display for private prayer and veneration through 3:00 p.m. The Daily Mass will also be celebrated by Bishop Bambera at 12:10 p.m.

Adult Confirmation

Pastors and Parish Life Coordinators are reminded that since Bishop Bambera has granted the faculty to pastors and sacramental ministers to confer the Sacrament of Confirmation in their own parishes, there is **no longer a need for pastors or sacramental ministers to request the faculty to confirm a baptized Catholic adult**. For this reason, the Adult Confirmation on Pentecost Sunday at the Cathedral of Saint Peter in Scranton has been discontinued.

Although past practice in the Diocese of Scranton has been to confirm baptized Catholic adults at the Easter Vigil, it would be more suitable to have them receive Confirmation with the eighth grade students in your parish on Pentecost (see *National Statutes for the Catechumenate* #26).

Extraordinary Minister of Communion Training



Daybreak Retreat



Lenten Resources for Ongoing Atonement and Healing in the Church

E ach parish in the Diocese of Scranton is encouraged to pray continuously for atonement and healing for victims of sexual abuse, especially during the Lenten season and during the month of April which is "National Child Abuse Prevention Month." The diocesan website has several resources for parishes to offer prayers for victims of sexual abuse that include:

- Stations of the Cross Booklet for Atonement and Healing
- The Light Is ON for You resources focused on Healing in the Church
- Intercessions for the Universal Prayer
- Pieta Prayer Card (in English and Spanish)
- A Rosary for Atonement and Healing using the Sorrowful Mysteries
- **Day of Atonement and Healing**—Family Participation Ideas for Home and Church
- Prayer Booklet for Atonement and Healing—for individuals or small groups
- Prayer Resources from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops—includes a sample prayer service, a rosary for Healing and Protection of the Vulnerable among us, litany for healing, sample intercessions and songs



• Liturgical Resources from the Federation of Diocesan Liturgical Commissions—suggested Mass preparations, sample Word service within Eucharistic Adoration, sample intercessions, psalmody, hymnody, and talking points

During the season of Lent, parishes are also asked to set aside one Sunday Mass intention on the Fifth Sunday of Lent for the victims of sexual abuse by clergy in our diocese.

Parishes are also invited to burn a **candle before an image of the Blessed Virgin Mary** during the season of Lent as a reminder of Our Lady's intercession and of our constant prayers for those victims of abuse.

Other group discussion resources are *The Wounded Body of Christ* by Matthew W. Halbach, Ph.D. (<u>Twenty-Third Publications</u>) and *Healing Our Church* by Jerome Herauf and Charles Paolino (<u>RENEW International</u>).
