As parishes make final preparations for the conferral of the Sacrament of Confirmation by pastors and sacramental ministers on Pentecost (June 9, 2019), pastors and parish life coordinators are reminded of the following:

- *Order of Confirmation*—the bilingual ritual book was made available to pastors and parish life coordinators at the recent priest convocation. If your parish is still in need of a copy, please contact the Office for Parish Life by May 15, 2019. - A Message from Bishop Bambera —a message from Bishop Bambera to the Confirmation candidates is being prepared and will be sent to pastors and parish life coordinators. In order to further establish the Bishop's role as the ordinary minister of Confirmation, this message is to be read by the pastor/sacramental minister as part of the homily for the Confirmation.
- Other Forms and Documents regarding Confirmation can be found on the diocesan website under Parish Life, Christian Initiation & Sacraments. These include:
 - ♦ Presentation of Candidates by DREs or Confirmation Coordinators
 - ♦ Sample Universal Prayer
 - ◆ Confirmation Record-must be returned to the Office for Parish Life following Confirmation with pastor or sacramental minister

Pastors and Parish Life Coordinators are reminded that since Bishop Bambera has granted the faculty to pastors and sacramental ministers to confer the Sacrament of Confirmation in their own parishes, there is **no longer a need for pastors or sacramental ministers to request the faculty to confirm a baptized Catholic adult.** For this reason, the Adult Confirmation on Pentecost Sunday at the Cathedral in Scranton has been discontinued.



The FOCCUS® Pre-Marriage Inventory is a comprehensive, user-friendly tool for use by lay individuals, couples or professionals who are helping couples prepare for marriage, and who become trained as FOCCUS Facilitators. The FOCCUS® Inventory is designed to help engaged couples appreciate their unique relationship, learn more about themselves, and discuss topics important to their lifelong marriage.

Parish Social Justice Trust Fund Grants

The Social Justice Trust Fund Grant Application for 2019-2020 are now available under the Parish Life/ Service section on the diocesan website. Whether or not your parish has applied for a grant in the past, please con-



sider applying this year. Grants may benefit any program based on service or social justice activities. In the past, parishes have used the Social Justice Trust Fund to benefit food pantries, run educational programs, and serve marginalized communities.

We especially encourage you to apply for a grant (up to \$5,000) if you have members of your parish who are interested in advocacy, social justice/environmental education, or ministries to persons with disabilities. We have recognized these needs in our communities and hope that parishes will prioritize some of these causes in their applications.

Diocesan Partnership with the Center for Ministry Development

The Certificate in Ministry Studies® is a ministry education program for adults in ministry with youth, families and adults, in both parish and school settings. It equips leaders with the knowledge, skills, practical tools, and techniques needed for creative and comprehensive faith formation and/or youth ministry.

Participants in the Certificate Program must be at least 18 years of age, have graduated from high school, and meet Diocesan safe environment requirements.

This program will promote dynamic leadership for Lifelong Faith Formation and Youth Ministry in parishes and schools. The potential audience for the program includes: coordinators of youth ministry, directors of religious education, parish catechists, family faith formation team members, youth ministry volunteer leaders, junior high leaders, high school campus ministers, teachers, clergy, university

students and seminarians. Individual weekends are also helpful for leaders who specialize in particular ministries. For example, the Justice and Service course can serve leaders involved in social justice ministries.

The primary aim of the program is to promote personal, spiritual, and ministerial growth. Courses in the first year cover faith formation and youth ministry principles and practices, as well as leadership theory, processes, and skills. The second year focuses on fostering faith growth through evangelization and catechesis, prayer and worship, justice and service, and pastoral care.

The Certificate in Ministry Studies® includes four online course and eight in-person courses. These in-person courses are offered in our Diocese in a weekend format over two years.

The Certificate program is utilized in a number of ways:

- as an integrated formation program leading to a Certificate in Youth Ministry Studies
 OR a Certificate in Lifelong Faith Formation;
- as an enrichment or continuing education program for veteran leaders;
- as a workshop series which can be taken on a course-by-course basis by professional or volunteer leaders.

The Office for Parish Life is preparing to offer this program locally, beginning Fall 2019.
