### **Principles of Youth Ministry**

Presented by Tom East,
Director of the Center for Ministry Development

This course day presents the foundational understandings and principles for developing an effective ministry with younger and older adolescents. This course presents the vision and principles for comprehensive youth ministry and a model for youth ministry which



incorporates developmentally-appropriate youth programming, strengthens family life, involves young people as integral members of the faith community, and collaborates with the wider community in a common effort to promote faith growth. This will include examination of foundational Church documents that shape youth ministry as well as research of best practices in ministry with adolescents.

### **Principles of Lifelong Faith Formation**

Presented by Joan Weber, from the Center for Ministry Development

This course day presents the foundations and principles for developing effective lifelong catechesis with people of all ages in the parish community; a vision for catechesis for children, youth, adults, and families, rooted in Church documents and Tradition; the current context for faith formation in the 21st century, as well as models for effective parish catechesis.



The cost for either course is \$35 for individuals enrolled in the full two-year certificate process (cost for course materials) or \$85 for a guest participant taking a single course or coming from another diocese. In his letter announcing the 2019 World Day of the Poor, Pope Francis spoke about Jean Vanier, calling him a "great apostle of the poor." ### **World Day of Prayer for Creation**

September 1 marks the **World Day of Care for Creation**. This month, we ask you to think about ways that we, as Catholics, are called to be stewards of the environment.

If we approach nature and the environment without...openness to awe and wonder, if we no longer speak the language of fraternity and beauty in our relationship with the world, our attitude will be that of masters, consumers, ruthless exploiters, unable to set limits on their immediate needs. By contrast, if we feel intimately united with all that exists, then sobriety and care will well up spontaneously. (*Laudato Si*, 11)

Consider using this month as an opportunity to lead a family service project or park clean-up. Or, you might spread the news by publishing tips on helping the environment in your parish's bulletin, or praying for the Care for Creation in your weekly intercessions.

Finally, in honor of the Day of Care for Creation, our **Diocesan Day of Service** on **September 21** will be themed around this topic. All youth and young adults are invited to attend to help serve the community while reflecting on Laudato Si and the ecology of creation. ### "Baptized and Sent: The Church of Christ on Mission in the World"

aptized and Sent: The Church of Christ on Mission in the World" is the theme chosen by Pope Francis for the Extraordinary Mission Month. Awakening the awareness of the missio ad gentes, and reinvigorating the sense of responsibility for proclaiming the Gospel with new enthusiasm, are themes that combine the pastoral concern of Pope Benedict XV in his Apostolic Letter Maximum Illud, published 544 years ago, with the missionary vitality expressed by Pope Francis in his recent Apostolic Exhorta-



tion *Evangelii Gaudium*: "Missionary action is the paradigm of every work of the Church." (EG 15) There are four dimensions, specified by the Pope, to live more intensely the journey of preparation for the Extraordinary Missionary Month October 2019:

- 1. A personal encounter with Jesus Christ alive in His Church through the Eucharist, the Word of God, personal and communal prayer;
- 2. Testimony: missionary saints, martyrs and confessors of the faith, as an expression of the Church scattered throughout the world;
- 3. Missionary formation: biblical, catechetical, spiritual and theological;
- 4. Missionary charity.

The Office for Parish Life, in collaboration with the Office of the Pontifical Missions will be providing experiences and resources leading up to this special observance, and throughout the coming year, to help parishes and families to foster mission awareness and participation.
