

Preparing Our Hearts for Lent: Journey Together in Ministry

The Office for Parish Life will be holding "Preparing Our Hearts for Lent: A Journey Together in Ministry" Retreat. This is a retreat for Pastoral Associates, Participants in Lay Ministry Formation, DREs, Youth Ministers and other catechetical leaders who will gather for prayer, reflection and fellowship. The retreat will be held at the Holy Trans-



figuration Retreat Center, 1000 Seminary Rd., Dalton, PA. The retreat begins on Friday evening with arrival between 5:00-6:00p.m. and will conclude by 3:00p.m. on Saturday. The cost is \$100 and includes the retreat program, meals and lodging. Father Michael Bryant will be the retreat facilitator.

Building on the relationships created among parish leaders, DREs and Youth Ministers will be better equipped to nurture the young people and families entrusted to them.

Family—A Journey of Faith

Pope Francis has called on Church leaders to accompany youth on their journey of faith. This is not enough, we also need to accompany their parents. This workshop looks at ways catechetical leaders



can journey with parents, reinforcing them in spreading the faith to their children at home and in the parish. Since most parents feel unsure or inadequate when it comes to teaching the faith, we will look at ways to help parents to grow their own faith, before we move to concentrate on useful approaches for helping the family grow together in their faith lives.

Renewing Religious Education (RE)

At the core of catechesis, we find Jesus Christ. Catechesis has to be more than textbooks and tests to determine if one is prepared for the sacraments. Lifelong faith formation that leads to salvation should be our focus. Religious Ed, with its emphasis on our teaching, has to be placed within the context of an overall inclusive ministry and seen as a piece in the practice of evangelization. We need to form a community of learners by creating a program that is centered on the events of parish life. We have to be enthusiastic about moving away from the things that need to change. Let's come together and discuss our programs-both the successes and the failures.

Sunday of the Word of God

On September 30, 2019, Pope Francis, in his Apostolic Letter, *Aperuit Illis: Instituting the Sunday of the Word of God*, announced that the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time would be celebrated as the **Sunday of the**



Word of God. This year, that Sunday will fall on **January 26, 2020.** The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops and the Federation of Diocesan Liturgical Commissions have prepared resources to help parishes observe this feast. The <u>USCCB resource</u> has catechetical, ecumenical, liturgical and prayer resources available, and the <u>FDLC resource</u> includes the text of *Aperuit Illis*, pastoral suggestions, sample intercessions, and music suggestions. Order of Baptism of Children

A revised translation of *The Order of Baptism of Children* was recently approved by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops and confirmed by Rome for use in the dioceses of the United States America beginning on February 2, 2020 (Presentation of the

FOCCUS© Facilitator Training and Refresher Course

The Office for Parish Life will offer a FOCCUS Premarriage Inventory Facilitator Training and refresher option on February 29, 2020. (Snow date 4/4/2020) The training will be held at the Diocesan Pastoral Center from 9AM to 3PM, a light lunch will be included. The Full Training fee is \$100 for an individual or \$150 for a couple. For those who have already taken the 5-hour training and have a *FOCCUS Facilitator Manual* and a certification number, but want to refresh their knowledge about FOCCUS Facilitating, the refresher option fee will be \$50 per person. (Anyone trained in FOCCUS can use the same skills for REFOCCUS.) If you, parish staff, or Sponsor Couples in your parish are interested in this training or refresher, please contact Jennifer Housel at the Office for Parish Life.

What is the FOCCUS© Pre-Marriage Inventory, and what is REFOCCUS? The FOCCUS Pre-Marriage Inventory is a comprehensive, user-friendly tool for use by lay individuals, couples or professionals who are helping couples prepare for marriage, and who become trained as FOCCUS Facilitators. The FOCCUS© Inventory is designed to help engaged couples appreciate their unique relationship, learn more about themselves, and discuss topics important to their lifelong marriage. REFOCCUS is an inventory tool very similar to FOCCUS, but is to be used by couples who are already married. It is an easy and effective means of marriage enrichment, helpful at any stage in a marriage.

If you would like to discern whether you are called to be a FOCCUS or REFOCCUS Facilitator, please speak to your pastor about this ministry in your parish.

Retrouvaille Returns to the Diocese of Scranton

Retrouvaille is a peer ministry of volunteer couples that can help you learn the tools of healthy communication, build intimacy and heal, just as they have done in their own marriages. Retrouvaille is Christian-based, and Catholic in origin, but welcomes couples of all faiths as well as non-religious couples. If your marriage is in distress, even if you are currently separated or divorced, Retrouvaille can help get your relationship back on track.


