Year of Saint Joseph

his year marks the 150th Anniversary of Pope Pius IX's decree, **Ouemadmodum Deus**, naming Saint Joseph, husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary and foster-father of Jesus, as the Patron of the Universal Church. In commemoration of this anniversary and recognizing the fitting time for the Church to invoke the intercession of this guardian, His Excellency, Bishop Joseph C. Bambera has declared this year as a "Year of Saint Joseph" to be observed in the Diocese of Scranton from March 19, 2020 to March 19, 2021. Bishop Bambera states, "Just as Saint Joseph watched over



and protected the Lord Jesus while he was on earth, we need Saint Joseph to watch over and provide for the Church today. His intercession on behalf of the Universal Church is vital as the world faces so much upheaval and pain, and particularly as it confronts the uncertainty and pain of the coronavirus epidemic."

Bishop Bambera invites all of the faithful to renew their devotion to Saint Joseph during this commemorative year, and to seek his powerful intercession to safely guard the Church from all evils, just as he protected the Holy Family from harm. Health Precautions and the Liturgy

Recently, Bishop Bambera released the following precautionary directives for the celebration of Mass related to widespread flu activity and the outbreak of the coronavirus, which has now surfaced within the territory of the Diocese of Scranton:

- The faithful are strongly encouraged at this time to receive the Body of Christ (via the Sacred Host) in the hand, but the right of each individual to receive on the tongue, as guaranteed by the universal law of the Church, remains in place and is to be respected. This request is made in order to curtail the spread of germs to the communicant, the minister of Holy Communion and other communicants.
- The faithful should refrain from the use of holy water upon entering and exiting our churches. Out of an abundance of caution, pastors should remove holy water from fonts in an effort to reduce the possible transmission of the virus.
- Parishes should make proper provisions for persons with celiac disease who cannot digest the gluten in wheat hosts or have other sensitivities.
- Elderly parishioners who are not sick but are concerned about being in crowded spaces are not bound by the Sunday Mass obligation.

These temporary changes come in addition to those announced on March 3, 2020:

- The distribution of the Precious Blood via the Chalice is temporarily suspended.
- The Sign of Peace will now be exchanged without physical contact.
- Priests, deacons and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion should practice good hygiene, washing their hands before Mass begins or even using an alcohol based anti-bacterial solution before and after distributing Holy Communion.
- Parishioners are also reminded that if they are sick, especially with flu-like symptoms, they should stay home for their own well-being and that of others. If parishioners are sick or suspect they are sick with a contagious illness, they are not bound by the Sunday Mass obligation.

Undoubtedly, other concerns may be raised as we confront the spread of the coronavirus. We would encourage vigilance and discretion by priests and faithful to use common sense and good hygiene.

We pray for all the sick, in particular those suffering from the flu or from the coronavirus. We pray for the researchers trying to find a treatment and we pray for those who are caring for the sick throughout the world.

Becoming Faithful Curators: Discovering and Evaluating Resources for Serving a 21st Century Church

Saturday, April 18, 2020 from 9:00AM to 3:00PM at St. Gregory Parish, Clarks Green

Parish leaders have the significant responsibility of curating the knowledge and practices of the Catholic Christian religion they provide their parishioners. Recall Jesus' graphic message (Mt 18:6; Lk 17:2) about those who lead the little ones astray suffering a fate *worse than* drowning with a mill-stone tied about their necks? Jesus is so emphatic because at stake is people's ability to have a healthy relationship with God and to live the gospel authentically. This responsibility has perhaps been made even more challenging by the sometimes overwhelming availability of information today, even in the area of faith. How can we acquire religious "information literacy?"

Faithful curation involves discerning:

- relevance to the times and to the audience
- opportunities for access
- faithfulness to the gospel and to the Church
- loads of humility

We will discuss useful yardsticks for measuring the appropriateness of information and practice applying them to typical choices parish leaders



make, like deciding on programs and publications, Scriptural interpretations, news sources and prayer experiences.
