

- II How long will you all attack one *man* to break *him* down, as though he were a tottering *wall*, or a tumbl*ing* fence?


- I Their plan is only to destroy: they take pleasure *in* lies.





who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God for ever and ever.




REPOSITION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT


