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Uncharted Waters of Blended Learning

Over twenty parishes in our diocese are preparing to use the new platform, Faith Alive! powered by Edmodo with communication and collaboration tools built for religious education and focused on faith formation outcomes, and about twenty-five more parishes are still studying and considering it. On this platform, your entire religious education community learns together—in person, online or anywhere in-between. The benefits of using hybrid learning as a parish:

- **This platform provides a flexible classroom space that lets DREs/teachers/catechists and their families connect—no matter where they are.** Classroom features give parishes a versatile space to conduct engaging lessons—complete with rigorous discussions, robust assessment and assignment tools, fun class challenges, and to create family faith formation experiences.
- **Your faith formation resources are just a few clicks away in your private resource library.** Reduce the time it takes your parish DREs/catechists/teachers to create lessons by providing them access to all of our religious education resources, all in one place.
- **Quickly build interactive weekly lessons.** Our customizable lesson builder lets your DREs assemble warm-ups, activities, small groups, faith experiences—anything you can think of—into a weekly/daily playlist for

students to work through at their pace.

You will have access to whether the family is engaged. Dashboards allow teachers/DRES to monitor progress in real time, and students can easily ask questions and get feedback.

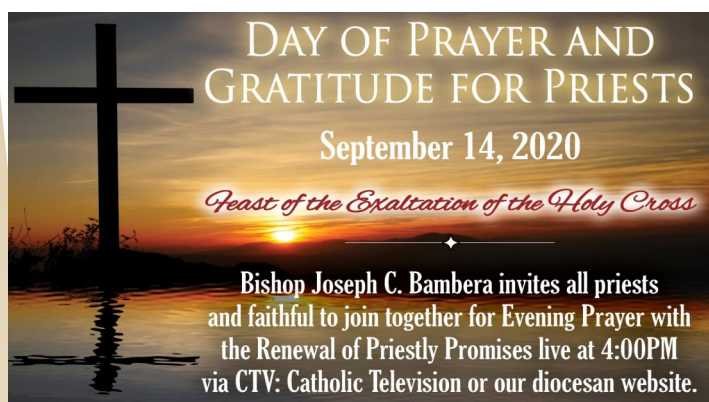
Virtual Learning Community for Faith Formation

The Essentials of Catholic Liturgy

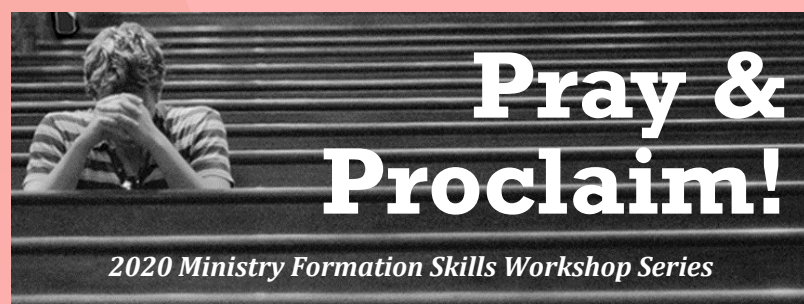
Liturgy Training Publications, in partnership with the National Association of Pastoral Musicians (NPM), is presenting **The Essentials of Catholic Liturgy**, a series of training courses offered in three tracks, designed to assist participants in need of various levels of instruction.

Beginning Monday, September 14, **Track 1: The Basics of Liturgy** will provide an introduction to the liturgy of the Roman Catholic Church. Participants join interactive conversations, read texts, watch videos, and connect with fellow ministers across the country – all of which will strengthen their ministries and inspire their efforts to create vibrant liturgies that help the faithful “become thoroughly imbued with the spirit and power of the liturgy.” (*Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy*, 14)

Track 1: The Basics of Liturgy is for:

- **Music Directors:** Gain a deeper understanding of the liturgical year, allowing you to plan your parish and choir's repertoire with confidence.
- **Cantors and musicians:** Sing, play, and lead music in your parish with greater context, helping provide formation to the assembly's song.
- **Liturgy and Ministry Coordinators:** Understand the role of each ministry in parish and liturgical life, and how strong liturgical ministries assist in liturgy.
- **All who want a greater understanding of liturgy—** parish staff, liturgy committee members, sacristans, and all parishioners.

PreCana Options for the Remainder of 2020, and Looking to 2021

After a spring and early summer pause due to the coronavirus, we have held two in-person PreCana Days of Reflection, one in July 2020, and one in August 2020. It is our hope and intention to continue to offer in-person PreCana Days throughout the remainder of 2020 and into 2021. Many health and safety guidelines have been put into place, and we will continue to follow state and diocesan guidelines moving forward.

The FOCCUS Inventory, facilitated with an engaged couple by a pastor or by a certified marriage sponsor couple, is another option for marriage preparation. FOCCUS can be a stand-alone formation tool or it can be used in addition to a PreCana Day or an online PreCana program.

Online PreCana is another option for sacramental formation. We currently recommend an outside vendor for online PreCana, but are in the process of creating our own online PreCana experience using the new *Faith Alive!* platform, powered by Edmodo. We hope to have our Diocese of Scranton online PreCana Class up and running by the end of 2020.

Virtual Offering for 2021

Through the new *Faith Alive!* platform available for faith formation in our diocese, we plan to offer online Strength's workshops in 2021. These workshops aim to increase appreciation and engagement, using insights gained through Gallup's CliftonStrengths Assessment (formerly Strengthsfinder).

Jen Housel recently completed the training required to be a Gallup-Certified Strengths Coach, and she is ready to share Gallup's tools on behalf of diocesan and parish staff, as well as parishioner groups and engaged or married couples.

Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship

Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship is the teaching document of the Catholic Bishops of the United States on the political responsibility of Catholics. It provides guidance for all who seek to exercise their rights and duties as citizens. As Catholics, we bring the richness of our faith to the public square. We draw from both faith and reason as we seek to affirm the dignity of the human person and the common good of all.

Everyone living in this country is called to participate in public life and contribute to the common good. In *Rejoice and Be Glad* [*Gaudete et exsultate*], Pope Francis writes:

Your identification with Christ and his will involves a commitment to build with him that kingdom of love, justice and universal peace. . . . You cannot grow in holiness without committing yourself, body and soul, to giving your best to this endeavor.

As Catholics, we are part of a community with profound teachings that help us consider challenges in public life, contribute to greater justice and peace for all people, and evaluate policy positions, party platforms, and candidates' promises and actions in light of the Gospel in order to help build a better world.

Season of Creation 2020: Jubilee Time for the Earth

September 1 marks the **World Day of Care for Creation** and the beginning of the **Season of Creation**. This month, we ask you to think about ways that we, as Catholics, are called to be stewards of the environment.

If we approach nature and the environment without...openness to awe and wonder, if we no longer speak the language of fraternity and beauty in our relationship with the world, our attitude will be that of masters, consumers, ruthless exploiters, unable to set limits on their immediate needs. By contrast, if we feel intimately united with all that exists, then sobriety and care will well up spontaneously. (*Laudato Si*, 11)

Or, you might spread the news by publishing tips on helping the environment in your parish's bulletin, or praying for the Care for Creation in your weekly intercessions. World Day of Migrants and Refugees—Sunday, September 27, 2020

The theme chosen by the Holy Father for the 106th World Day of Migrants and Refugees is "**Forced like Jesus Christ to flee**" to focus on the pastoral care of internally displaced people (IDPs). In his message for this year's observance Pope Francis writes:

When we talk about migrants and displaced persons, all too often we stop at statistics. But it is not about statistics, it is about real people! If we encounter them, we will get to know more about them. And knowing their stories, we will be able to understand them. We will be able to understand, for example, that the precariousness that we have come to experience as a result of this pandemic is a constant in the lives of displaced people.
