Bishop's Youth Awards

s you are all aware, over the past few months we have made every effort to ensure the safety and well-being of the faithful in the Diocese of Scranton. With this in mind, some adjustments have been made in the preparation for and celebration of

the Bishop's Youth Awards. In September, each parish/school will receive an email requesting the nominations for the awards.

OFFICE FOR PARISH LIFE

Once we have received the nominations, we will process the forms and mail the awards back to the parish/school. Each parish/school will be responsible for presenting the awards to their nominees. Here is a timeline for this year's awards:

Oct. 5	Nomination Emails are sent out. Due back by Oct. 21 As nominations come in, proof list of nominees will be emailed to all parishes/schools. Once the list is verified by pastor/principle, Congratulation emails will be sent to all parishes/schools to be forwarded to all nominees.
Oct. 18	Each parish/school should begin to look for a presenter, altar servers, lectors, cantors for the BYA Mass.
Oct. 21	Final date for nominations
Oct. 23	An email with suggestions for the Mass will be sent to each parish/school
Oct. 25	Final list of nominees will be sent to every parish/ school for the presenters.
Oct. 28	Awards, certificate and Message from Bishop Bambera will be mailed to parishes/schools
Nov. 8, 15, or 22	Dates for the BYA Mass-Each parish will chose their own date. Schools can hold their mass any day between Nov. 8-22

The email for nominations was sent in late September. Please check your email.

LTP Virtual Workshops



The Respect Life Program is a year-round effort designed to help Catholics understand, value, and work to encourage a culture that cherishes every human life. Our church teaches that every human life, from that of an unborn baby to that of a prisoner on death row, retains the dignity of a person.

In the 2020-2021 Respect Life theme, "Live the Gospel of Life." Reflection we read:

Twenty-five years ago, Pope St. John Paul II wrote that the Gospel of life is at the heart of Jesus' saving message to the world (Evangelium vitae 1). In taking on human flesh, dwelling among us, and sacrificing his very life for our redemption, Christ reveals the profound dignity of every human person. This God-given dignity does not change with our stage of life, abilities, level of independence, or any other varying circumstance.

Bishop Bambera will celebrate Respect Life Sunday on October 4th at 10:00 AM in the Cathedral of Saint Peter. This Mass will also be live-streamed.


World Mission Sunday

Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship

Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship is the teaching document of the Catholic Bishops of the United States on the political responsibility of Catholics. It provides guidance for all who seek to exercise their rights and duties as citizens. As Catholics, we bring the richness of our faith to the public square. We draw from both faith and reason as we seek to affirm the dignity of the human person and the common good of all.

Everyone living in this country is called to participate in public life and contribute to the common good. In *Rejoice and Be Glad* [*Gaudete et exsultate*], Pope Francis writes:



Your identification with Christ and his will involves a commitment to build with him that kingdom of love, justice and universal peace. . . . You cannot grow in holiness without committing yourself, body and soul, to giving your best to this endeavor.

As Catholics, we are part of a community with profound teachings that help us consider challenges in public life, contribute to greater justice and peace for all people, and evaluate policy positions, party platforms, and candidates' promises and actions in light of the Gospel in order to help build a better world.
