

World must realize common humanity or fall apart, pope says

Pope Francis was among several world and religious leaders who took part in a virtual event today recognizing the International Day of Human Fraternity.

The world must begin to realize its shared humanity in order to live peacefully, otherwise it risks falling apart in endless conflicts, Pope Francis said during the event.

"Today, there is no time for indifference," the pope said. "We cannot wash our hands of it, with distance, with disregard, with contempt. Either we are brothers and sisters or everything falls apart."
