



OCP Parish Grants Program

The COVID-19 pandemic has created extensive hardships for parishes across the country, many forced to find new ways to meet the spiritual needs of their



communities while working with an increasingly tight budget. It is for this reason that Oregon Catholic Press (OCP) is honored to partner with communities of faith across the country through its annual OCP Parish Grants Program, aimed at supporting and enhancing the worship experience of the faithful as they begin their return to inperson celebrations. Since its inception in 2001, the OCP Parish Grants program has awarded over \$3.3 million to parishes throughout the country.

Applications for the OCP Parish Grants Program are being accepted through May 30, 2021. All applicants are required to fill out an online application providing information about their parish—demographics, pastoral ministries offered and intentions for the grant. Recipients will be announced in August. Awarded grants must be used for liturgical and/or musical purposes. Applicants do not need to currently use an OCP worship program in order to qualify.




