Ministry of Worship / Liturgy

We are called to gather in prayer and holy sacrifice to worship, contemplate, and respond to the Holy Sacrifice of the Cross through a robust, diverse and welcoming liturgy rooted in a rich Catholic tradition in order to deepen our faith, hope and love in God and to announce the Gospel through our words and deeds.

Liturgical Ministry

Altar Servers

For any boys and girls who have received their First Holy Communion until graduation from High School. They would be paired with a Mentor Server for the first couple months after several orientation practices. They would be welcome to serve whenever needed but would be scheduled for the Holy Mass of choice about once or twice a month.

Weekday Servers

For anyone who has received their First Holy Communion or older. They would be assigned one week a month for either the 8am or 12:10 Holy Mass. They would need to come 30 minutes prior to set up for the Holy Mass.

Funeral Altar Servers

For anyone who has received their First Holy Communion or older and is available from 9:30am to 11am for funerals. They would be scheduled only as available.

Proclaimer of God's Word (Lector)

For anyone who has received the Sacrament of Confirmation or older. They would need to practice the readings before the Holy Mass. They would then be scheduled at their Holy Mass of choice about once a month.

Weekday Proclaimer

For anyone who has received the Sacrament of Confirmation or older. They would be assigned one week a month for either the 8am or 12:10 Holy Mass.

Funeral Proclaimer

For anyone who has received the Sacrament of Confirmation or older and is available from 9:30am to 11am for funerals. They would be scheduled only as available.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion

For anyone 18 years of age or older who has received the Sacrament of Confirmation. They would need to participate in on going formation and can be present at Holy Mass or for those who are sick or homebound.

Ushers

For anyone who has received the Sacrament of Confirmation or older. They would be available for a particular Holy Mass as needed to take up the collection and help people find seating within the church along with assisting the pastor as needed.

Ministers of Hospitality / Greeters

For anyone who has received their First Holy Communion or older. They would welcome people to our parish, hand out bulletins, help with directions and be the first smiling face of welcome for our visitors.

Sacristan

For anyone who has received the Sacrament of Confirmation or older. They would need to be available 30 minutes prior to Holy Mass in order to set up. They would be scheduled once or twice a month along with Holy Days of Obligation and other special occasions.

Church Decorations

For anyone who would be interested in helping to decorate the church for the major feasts, water the plants, and remove the decorations as needed.

Washers of the Sacred Linens

For anyone who has received the Sacrament of Confirmation or older and can use an iron and washing machine. They would do the linens one month per year. Some training is required.

Music Ministry

Choir of Angels

For any boys or girls who have received their First Holy Communion until graduation from High School. Practice is once a week for an hour and half. They sing at Holy Mass around once a month.

Choir

Open to all ages but is mostly adults. Practice is once a week for an hour and half. They sing every 10:30am Holy Mass during the school year. They also sing for Holy Days and the Triduum along with special occasions.

Cantors


For anyone is has the ability to lead the people in song. They practice about an hour before their scheduled Holy Mass. They are scheduled for their Holy Mass of choice as often as available and needed.

Funeral Choir

This group gathers for funerals about 30 minutes prior to the funeral. Most of the music is very familiar. Funerals are typically around 10am. Participation is at your availability.

Instrumentalists

Any and all instruments are welcome for any of the groups. There would be some practice times involved but are on an as needed basis. Music will be provided well in advance of the Liturgical Celebration.

Family Christmas Celebration

Easter Egg Hunt

Held the Saturday before Easter in the afternoon this event brings children together to celebrate the search for the Risen Lord. Began in 2015 this event is open to our younger children and volunteers of any age.

Canoe and Kayak Trip

St. Drogo Coffee House

Little League Concessions

Every year hundreds of people flock the streets of Williamsport to celebrate Little League. This concession stand has all the food and drink that goes along with a great game of baseball. Help is always needed and volunteers are always appreciated.

Outreach Ministries

Children's Clothing Closet

Opening our doors in 2014 this ministry provides clothing for little ones and support for the parents who bring them. Every Tuesday through the year we can use help sorting and welcoming our guests in the Castellano Center for Community Outreach. Donations and volunteers are always appreciated!

Food Pantry

Open every Wednesday afternoon we welcome those who are in need to the basement of the Administration Building. Help is needed to gather our donations, bring them downstairs, sort and bag for our guests and, if needed, carry them up the stairs. All ages are welcome!

Family Promise

Two or three times a year we welcome families who are in need to the Castellano Center for Community Outreach. We need volunteers to help cook dinner and stay with our guests through the night.

First Friday Calls

Every First Friday our team of Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion visits our parish members who are homebound, in the hospitals, or in the nursing homes. If you just want to ride along and help hand out a bulletin and a smile, your presence would be greatly appreciated!

Hospital Ministry

Every Sunday a team of Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion head to UPMC Susquehanna Hospital to bring Jesus to those who are sick. We also work with the hospital to train others to visit with the sick through the week.

Funeral Luncheons

Chicken Dinners during the week and Baked Ziti on Fridays are offered for the family in their time of grief. We serve the meals buffet style and clear the plates in order to help the families share time together. A wonderful ministry which shares the love of Christ.

St. Vincent DePaul Society

Helps to address the financial needs of people who are in a difficult spot. Using financial consulting, this ministry helps to restore the dignity of the individual as it helps move them to a greater financial stability.

Prayer Warrior Ministry

No matter what you can't do - you can always pray! This ministry gathers together all the prayer needs of the parish and lifts them before our loving Father through intercessory prayer. You would be a member of a prayer chain to pray for all the needs of those who come to us for prayer.

St. Maria Goretti Prison Ministry

Every week we provide a Catholic Bible Study in the Lycoming County Prison. During this study we walk with those who have made some poor decisions in order to help them embrace the Sacrament of Reconciliation and come home!

Holiday Trees

Through the months of November to January, we collect needed items which help get people through the winter months. Hats, mittens, scarfs, gift cards, and food items are collected in a variety of events along with items for our military overseas. Help to distribute these items along with donations and collection of the items are greatly appreciated.

Facilities

Plumbers / **Carpenters** / **Electricians** / **HVAC** Our facilities consist of five buildings. These buildings range from ancient to modern in their construction and design. We also have older members who are on a fixed income and are in need of help with their homes. Ministry of Word / Life Long Learning

Catechesis - Learning about the Faith

PreK through 6th Grade Classes

We offer Religious Education Classes on Sundays through the school year at 9:15am. They begin with a morning exercise of prayer and song which leads to a class focused on our Catholic Faith.

Catechists (PreK through 6th Grade)

We are always in need of help to teach our students in the ways of faith. If you are interested in being a catechist or helper there is some training necessary. Mostly, we need a person with an open heart and willingness to grow with the students in their relationship with Christ.

Vacation Bible School

Every summer we offer a fun and exciting opportunity to grow in our faith. Using multimedia, song, snack, and fun games we come together to celebrate our faith for one week. A variety of volunteers are needed in order to make this week such a success.

Challenge & Conquest

Are 100%, service-based ministries for boys and girls **grades 3rd-6th** (with the potential of expanding (K-6th). The programs teach about virtues, saints, while also completing service projects. Meetings take place Thursday evenings in the Fleming Center from 5:30-7:30pm. Dinner and fun included! Adults needed as mentors and guides.

Confirmation Preparation

According to the guidelines of the Diocese of Scranton we offer a two year program for the formation of our students who are between 7th and 12th grade. They meet Sundays after the 5pm Holy Mass throughout the school year. These students work with their mentors and fellow students to grow in the gifts of the Holy Spirit as they approach this special Sacrament.

Confirmation Mentors

We are in need of adults who have received their Sacrament of Confirmation to be mentors for our students. You would walk with our students through their two year program and help with growing in their understanding of their faith and how to put their faith into practice. They would meet with the students every Sunday evening during the school year.

Youth Ministry (LifeTeen)

We continue to walk with our students in developing their understanding of their lived faith through LifeTeen. Taking relevant topics we look at the Scripture and Tradition of the Church and see how our faith still applies to our life today. They meet every Sunday through the school year after the 5pm Holy Mass.

Youth Ministry Mentors

We are always in need of chaperones and adults who have received their Sacrament of Confirmation to mentor our students through to their young adulthood. Must be willing to talk about your journey of faith and how that journey has brought you the faith, hope and love needed in our world today. They meet with the students every Sunday or as needed.

John Bower Basketball Church League

This is for **Pre-School to 12th grade** students November to February. Beginning in 1962 this is the longest running ecumenical church league in the country. With one practice and game a week we build fellowship and a healthy sense of competition. Coaches are always needed and appreciated.

Reflections

Reflections group is a gathering of senior adults at St. Joseph the Worker Parish. Offered on a weekday, Reflections usually includes Mass together, followed by a meal, and then a prayer experience or social experience. Our SJW parish community bond grows as we help each other to grow in faith. It is so good to gather as God's family- come join us!

Marriage Preparation (Pre-Cana)

This new ministry is for a married couple to walk with a couple who is approaching the Sacrament of Matrimony. This ministry is starting to take shape and more information will be forth coming.

Baptismal Preparation Classes

We have a group of families who are willing to work with young couples. These families walk with the young couples through the Sacrament of Baptism, Godparents, and offer advice on how to live the faith in our modern times. We offer sessions once a month or as needed and rotate monthly.

Adult Faith Formation

Deacon Smith offers a class every Thursday Evening and Sunday Morning during the school year. Along with this we are looking at growing book studies and small group experiences in order to spread the faith to all who are searching. Meeting the person where they are along their journey, it is our hope to help them grow in their relationship with Christ and His Church.

Young Adult Ministry

This relatively new ministry works in collaboration with Penn College of Technology in order to reach out to students from ages 18 to 35. This ministry hopes to help these young adults to grow stronger in their faith and embrace their vocation in our larger world.

Welcoming Committee

This newly formed committee is looking for volunteers who are interested in welcoming all people to our parish family. Rite of Christian Initiation for Children

The RCIC is for children who have passed the age of reason (7) up to 18 years old and have not been baptized in the Roman Catholic Church. Welcoming them into the faith and helping them grow in their relationship with Christ and His Church.

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults

The RCIA is for anyone older that 18 years of age who has not been baptized or who is not a member of the Roman Catholic Church. The team journeys with them, helping them grow in their understanding of Scripture and Tradition and welcomes them into communion with the Church on Easter Vigil. We also walk with them as they continue their journey to an adult faith and relationship with Christ.

Welcome Home

In a confusing world people sometimes drift away from their faith and find themselves away from the Church not knowing how to come home. This new initiative is to welcome those who have wandered from the fold. We are in need to welcoming hearts and willing spirits to leave the 99 and go searching for that one lost sheep.
