



Mental Health and Our Faith— The Sanctuary Course for Catholics


What is The Sanctuary Course for Catholics? One in four people will be affected by a mental health problem at some point in their lives, yet the stigma surrounding mental illness silences many and prevents faith communities from responding compassionately and effectively. This eight-session course—designed for use in small groups—explores the realities of mental health and illness, as well as the vital need for faith-based community conversations about these topics. The sessions are accompanied by compelling films that feature the stories of Catholics living with mental health challenges, along with the insights of archbishops, theologians, and psychologists.

Who should participate in this course? The Sanctuary Course for Catholics is designed to raise awareness and start conversations in local parishes regarding mental health. Attendees may be:

- People with questions about mental health
- Mental health professionals with a wealth of knowledge to share
- Leaders or religious educators who want to engage their community in mental health conversations
- People supporting loved ones with mental health prob-
- People living with mental health problems

The Sanctuary Course for Catholics is for anyone who wants to learn about faith and mental health. It requires no previous training or expertise—just a willingness to engage in dialogue with your faith community. Each topic is explored from a psychological, social, and theological perspective.

World Day for Migrants and Refugees

On Sunday, September 26th we celebrate World Day for Migrants and Refugees. Church teaching calls on all Catholics to provide special attention to migrant populations; this call has important pastoral and policy dimensions, which are geared to the spiritual and physical well-being of migrants and their families and the communities that receive them. There are currently more than 70 million people around the world who have been forcibly displaced from their homes due to political instability, violence, and other reasons. We must continue to stand in solidarity with our refugee and migrant brothers and sisters.

Recognizing the vital role that the international community plays in providing support to these populations, the Vatican recently turned its attention to an initiative spearheaded by the United Nations that would create the first intergovernmental agreement to cover all dimensions of international migration: The UN Global Com-

pacts on Migration and on Refugees. The Vatican released a list of Twenty Points that can help to guide advocacy and other forms of engagement in the development of the compacts. These points can inform how Catholics should engage migrants who live in their communities or whom they might meet along the way. While the uses and implementation of the Twenty Points is versatile, they are particularly relevant to the development and finalization of the UN Global Compacts on Migration and Refugees that will occur over the next several months. The Twenty Points are structured around a set of four verbs: welcome, integrate, protect, and promote.
