Rite of Election

The Rite of Election will be celebrated by Bishop Bambera on **Sunday, March 6, 2022 at 2:30PM** at the Cathedral of Saint Peter in Scranton. If you still need to register your catechumen(s) or candidate(s), please contact David Baloga, Director for Worship, at <u>david-</u> <u>baloga@dioceseofscranton.org</u> or at 570-207-2213.

Please note that as a health precaution again this year, catechumens will <u>not</u> be gathering in the Cathedral sanctuary to sign their names in the Book of the Elect. **Catechumens will need to inscribe their names in the parish Book of the Elect <u>before</u> this year's celebration of the Rite of Election. Therefore, it is strongly recommended that each parish celebrate the Rite of Sending for catechumens that includes the signing of their names in the Book of Elect (see** *RCIA* **#113). Bishop Bambera will sign each parish Book of the Elect during the part of the Rite of Election where the catechumen signing would normally take place. The wearing of masks is still highly recommended for all those attending the Rite of Election.**
