The Drivers for Decision Making

In January we began to implement the process of "right sizing" our parishes as illustrated in the Vision 2030 Communication Booklet. The Office for Parish Life is currently supporting Transition Teams in 18 parishes to eventually create nine new "Linked Parishes". Those nine new "Linkages" will each share a pastor.

How were the parishes selected for the new linkages?

There are four "Drivers" that were studied in the decision-making process. They are:

- **Fewer Parishioners** Prior to the pandemic we saw that regular weekend Mass attendance had been on the decline. The total number of parishioners who are registered in all parishes in the Diocese of Scranton dropped by more than 16% between 2014 and 2020. The total number of Registered Parishioners was 268,949 in 2014 and was 224,075 in 2020.
- *Financial Challenges* In early 2021, 19 parishes had been identified to have significant bills, insurance premiums and or medical premiums that needed to be paid to the Diocese of Scranton. Like our households, our parishes are much more expensive to maintain. With fewer parishioners supporting the church overall, parish offertories have not been able to keep pace with the current financial realities.
- **Parish Infrastructure Needs** Many of our wonderful parish buildings were built in a different era. There are countless facilities with deferred maintenance needs and no planned funding stream for necessary repairs.
- *Diminishing Number of Priests* The number of Diocesan priests in active ministry has decreased significantly over the last several decades. In 2021 there were 97 priests in active ministry. In 2030 we are projected to have 62 priests in active ministry.

Please know that this first set of parishes is simply the first set. As we anticipate retirements and respond to any unexpected departures from ministry we will again utilize the Drivers For Decision-Making to guide future decisions.

Eucharistic Revival Kickoff

"My flesh for the life of the world" (John 6:51)

At their November 2021 general assembly meeting, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops voted to move forward with plans for a national Eucharistic Revival to renew the Church be enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. The multi-year Eucharistic Revival begins on Sunday, June 19, 2022, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi), and culminates with the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, July 17-21, 2024.

The Diocese of Scranton will begin its local observance of the Eucharistic Revival with a Pontifical Mass followed by a Eucharistic Procession celebrated by Bishop Bambera on the **Sunday, June 19, 2022 at 12:15 P.M.** at the Cathedral of Saint Peter, Scranton. Details regarding the Mass and resources, events, and programming for the Eucharistic Revival will follow.
