Eucharist: The Work of Our Redemption Series



Dispensation from Abstaining from Meat on Friday, March 17

Given the importance of the feast of Saint Patrick in the life of the Diocese of Scranton and in the lives of many Catholics, **Bishop Bambera is granting a dispensation from the Friday Lenten abstinence on Friday, March 17, 2023**, to those who wish to take advantage of this opportunity.



In the U.S., Catholics aged 14 and over are required to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and each Friday during Lent, and those who are 18 to 59 are also required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Because these are disciplines rather than doctrines of the Church, as the head authority in his diocese, a bishop can grant a dispensation from these rules.

It is not required that anyone make use of this dispensation. The dispensation does not apply to any other celebrations of Saint Patrick that might take place on any other Fridays in Lent. All the faithful who take advantage of this dispensation are encouraged to abstain from meat on some other day as part of their penitential practices during Lent and/or perform an act of service, prayer or sacrifice in keeping with the character of the Lent.

Revised Order of Penance

The **revised translation of the** *Order of Penance* was approved by the Bishops of the United States on June 17, 2021. It was confirmed by the Congregation for Divine Worship and Discipline of the Sacraments on April 25, 2022. **The rite may be used in the liturgy as of Ash Wednesday, February 22, 2023 and its use is obligatory in the dioceses of the United States on April 16, 2023 – The Second Sunday of Easter/Divine Mercy Sunday. A Spanish translation of the** *Order of Penance* **for the USA has not yet been prepared.**

Extraordinary Minister of Communion **Training Session**

A training session for new Extraordinary Ministers of Communion will take place on **Saturday**, **March 18 from** 9:00AM to 2:30PM at St. Maximilian Kolbe Parish **5112 Pocono Crest Rd., Pocono Pines.** This all-day training session is based on the Liturgical Ministry Resource created by the Diocesan Office for Parish Life, and covers the theology of the Eucharist and the Mass, the history and spirituality of the ministry, as well as the particular functions of the Extraordinary Minister of Communion, and how to properly prepare and carry out this ministry. Candidates for the training should have the approval of his or her pastor/parish life coordinator. There is no fee for the training, and lunch will be provided. Please note that it is necessary for candidates to attend the entire session to receive certification as an Extraordinary Minister of Communion. Current Extraordinary Ministers of Communion seeking a refresher course are also welcome to attend.


The Light Is ON for You

PreCana Days of Reflection

Because Christian marriage is a sacrament, the Catholic Church wants couples to be well-prepared. Dioceses and parishes offer marriage preparation to help couples develop a better understanding of the sacrament; to evaluate and deepen their readiness to live married life, and to gain insights into themselves.

Marriage preparation programs take different forms. Some couples attend a weekend retreat; others are matched with a "sponsor couple"; and others participate in a series of marriage preparation classes offered by their parish or diocese. The important thing for engaged couples to keep in mind as they check numerous items off their pre-wedding "to-do" list is the well-known adage, "Your wedding lasts a day, but your marriage lasts a lifetime." The Church encourages couples to invest time and energy into the all-important work of preparing for their married life together. (USCCB)
