We ask this in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.



CASE STATEMENT

The Diocesan Annual Appeal is the Diocese of Scranton's single most important fundraising initiative, and we're counting on your support. Poverty, hunger, and homelessness remain serious challenges in our community. Funds raised also help with vocations and priestly life, Catholic communications, Catholic education, and parish and spiritual life. We ask you to look deeply within your heart and help us reach our goal of \$4.5 million as we strive to bring the gift of hope to our brothers and sisters in need.

The DAA provides the funds necessary to support programs and ministries throughout the entire Diocese. It is our job as pastors, priests, Parish Life Coordinators, Appeal Ambassadors, parish and diocesan staff to educate our fellow Catholics about the good work that is accomplished through the DAA.

Please consider the following statements:

- People who feel **inspired** to give to a cause tend to give as much as they can.

<u>STEP</u>	1 - Commitment Weekend Overview
	Focus on Diocesan Annual Appeal at the normal Mass starting time before the beginning
	of Mass or as preferred by the Pastor.
	Call attention to the DAA Commitment Weekend.
	Show the DAA Video. (See scripts)
	Encourage parishioners to complete the pledge form.
	Mention parish goal.
STEP	2 - DAA Presentation
	Give thanks for the support from previous years.
	Share what the DAA funds (Catholic education, seminarian formation, Catholic Social Services, Parish Life, Communications, Faith Formation and Social Justice grants).
	Mention parish goal.
	Mention the goal of increasing parish participation by 5%.
STEP	3 - DAA Video
	Let us take a moment to listen and watch a video that highlights how your gifts impact the programs and ministries of the Church that support our friends and neighbors throughout the Diocese.
STEP	4 - In-Pew Gift Reflection and Pledge
	Thank parishioners for their attention to the video.
	Remind parishioners that 100% of their gift supports these ministries only.
	Ask parishioners to pray for these ministries.
	Encourage parishioners to submit a pledge card today.
	Walk through pledge cards with parishioners.
	Collect pledge cards.

TALKING POINTS FOR IN PEW COLLECTION

We ask that all parishes carry out in-pew presentations from the pulpit during all Masses on Celebration Weekend. The in-pew presentation is an opportunity to share information about the ministries and services available to the parishes and communities within our Diocese, and the importance of supporting those ministries through the Annual Appeal.

Intention weekend is vital to the success of the Appeal. The most effective in-pew presentations are delivered by the pastor and use the Appeal video.

If you are challenged to show the Appeal video, please contact the Office of Development for assistance at (570) 207-2250.

Please remember to remind parishioners of the importance of their participation – no matter how small the gift. Remain positive and treat the process as a celebration.

The following is a suggested script that can be delivered by the pastor:

Good morning! Today, we celebrate Celebration Weekend for the Diocesan Annual Appeal. The Appeal's theme "Our Call to Serve" aligns with the spirit of creating communities rooted in the Life of Jesus Christ. Each of us are called to become the loving, compassionate Christ that fed the hungry.

As Christ gave Himself to us, we are called to serve and be generous towards others. As a parishioner within the Diocese of Scranton, I invite you to join me in serving others through the Diocesan Annual Appeal. I want to take a moment to show you a video that further explains the impact of your gift.

(Show the Appeal Video.)

This is an opportunity for our parish to unite with the Diocese. There are several ways we can contribute to the Diocesan Annual Appeal. Many of you have already received information in the mail that included a pledge card. If you have already filled that out and sent it in or have made your gift online, thank you!

If you are here today and have not yet given, there is a pledge card in the pew that you can either fill out and place in the collection basket, or you can scan the QR code on the pledge card to make your gift online.

Thank you again for joining me in supporting the Appeal. Our generous gifts, combined with the gifts of all our brothers and sisters throughout our Diocese, go a long way in supporting our Church. I encourage you to look at the ad shared in today's bulletin that will provide further information about the Appeal and the impact that you make possible because of your generosity.

SAMPLE CAMPAIGN CADENCE AND ACTIVITIES

It can be difficult to "get started." Here are some suggestions for timing of activities that can help you be successful in your efforts to reach goal.

Beginning in early September:

- Place Diocesan Annual Appeal ads in your bulletin and on social media if your parish could run this ad for a few weeks leading up to Celebration Weekend, it will help!
- Remind parishioners that they will be receiving materials from the Diocese to make their gifts.
- Stress that gifts of any size are welcome and that participation is important.
- Appeal Ambassadors should begin attending parish council, society, and ministry meetings.

Weekend of September 16/17:

- Place "Celebration Weekend is next weekend" ad in your bulletin and on social media.
- Stress that gifts of any size are welcome and that participation is important.
- Share any social media posts from the Diocese on your parish's social media.

Weekend of September 23/24:

- Show video in church.
- Pastor is asked to focus his homily around Diocesan Annual Appeal.
- Have in pew envelopes distributed.
- Place "Celebration Weekend" ad in bulletin.
- Stress that gifts of any size are welcome and that participation is important.

October:

- Place ad of your choice in your bulletin AND/OR publicize progress toward goal in the bulletin please try to complete at least one of these action items every week!
- Make announcement that parishioners will receive a letter from you during the month to make their gift to the Appeal.
- Share as many social media stories pertaining to the Appeal as you can.

November

- Place ad of your choice in your bulletin AND/OR publicize progress toward goal in the bulletin please try to complete at least one of these action items every week!
- Encourage parishioners to make their gift before the end of the month to help your parish get to goal as well as to close out the Appeal before the Advent/Christmas Season.
- Coordinate with Appeal Ambassador to carry out parish plan for getting to goal.

December

• If your parish has not made goal, please continue, at your discretion, to publicize progress in your bulletin and/or through announcements at Mass.

January/February/March

- If your parish has not made goal, please continue, at your discretion, to publicize progress in your bulletin and/or through announcements at Mass.
- If your parish is close to goal, we're happy to work with you to help you reach goal by personalizing bulletin ads, sending letters to outstanding donors in your parish, etc.
- You can also include an envelope in your parish envelope packet for the Appeal during any or all of these months.

The Diocesan Development Office is happy to work with you in whatever way you see fit to help your parish reach goal. We are a resource for you and your parish, and we're all happy to help you in any way that we can.

SUGGESTED PETITIONS TO BE INCLUDED IN THE PRAYER OF THE FAITHFUL

These prayers of the faithful can be used at the pastor's discretion, but we do ask that you offer the following intention during Celebration Weekend (September 23/24):

That we are called to support the ministries of our church through the Diocesan Annual Appeal, that through our participation we continue to be channels of the living and loving presence of Christ, we pray to the Lord....

That we may see the Diocesan Annual Appeal as an opportunity to extend our love and service beyond the boundaries of our parish, we pray to the Lord....

That we understand that we touch many lives through the Diocesan Annual Appeal, and that the people whose lives we touch may know Christ's love, we pray to the Lord....

That the gifts we offer through the Diocesan Annual Appeal will truly reflect our love and thanksgiving for the many blessings that God has entrusted to us, we pray to the Lord....

That we may respond generously to the Diocesan Annual Appeal as faithful stewards of the gifts God has entrusted to us, we pray to the Lord....

That each one of us will be open to God's call and prayerfully consider how we can join in sacrifice to meet the needs of our faith community through the Diocesan Annual Appeal, we pray to the Lord....

That as we make our commitment to the Diocesan Annual Appeal, we may remember God's generosity to us, we pray to the Lord....

That God may bless our parish, strengthen our faith, and grant us the spirit of Catholic stewardship by opening our hearts to the Diocesan Annual Appeal, we pray to the Lord.....

ANNUAL APPEAL VIDEOS

Pastors have the opportunity to select <u>one of seven videos</u> to play during Celebration Weekend. Each video highlights one of the ministries that is supported by the Annual Appeal. The videos include:

<u>Catholic Schools</u>: A focus on the growing enrollment and Christ-focused curriculum of Saint Jude School in Mountain Top. Interviews include Catholic school students, parents and the school's principal.

<u>Catholic Social Services</u>: A focus on the programs that Catholic Social Services provides to local veterans, especially a former homeless Navy Veteran, Joe Bates, who is now living at St. Hedwig's Veterans Village in Kingston. Interviews include Bates and Luke Malonis, Catholic Social Services Case Manager.

<u>Communications</u>: A focus on how the Diocesan Office of Communications filmed and shared stories of the ongoing National Eucharistic Revival and Bishop Bambera's 12 Lenten Holy Hours, focusing heavily on parishes in Lycoming, Bradford and Wayne Counties. Interviews include parishioners from all three counties.

<u>Parish Life</u>: A focus on how the Diocesan Office for Parish Life assists and helps oversee RCIA Programs, and joy and those entering the Catholic Church at Easter experience. Interviews include two parishioners from the Church of Saint John in East Stroudsburg that joined this church at this year's Easter Vigil.

<u>Vocations</u>: A focus on several of our seminarians who attend Saint Mary's Seminary in Baltimore. This video provides a first-hand look "behind the walls" of the seminary and the education that Appeal donations help to fund. Interviews include seminarians Harrison Rapp, Jeremy Barket and now-Father Michael Boris.

<u>Social Justice Grants</u>: A focus on one of the 32 parishes that received a parish social justice grant in 2022 – Saint Paul Parish in Scranton. The parish receives a \$5,000 grant to help operate its weekly food pantry, which has seen a large increase in need. Last year, the parish distributed nearly 23,000 pounds of food to the community.

A Spanish Video is also currently in production and will be completed by the time of distribution. The video narration and all interviews will be in Spanish
