## **Diocese of Scranton Vocations Office** Lesson Plans for 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade Catholic School Students

In the study, *Consideration of Priesthood and Religious Life Among Never-Married U.S. Catholics by the Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate at Georgetown University - Washington, D.C.* that was published by the USCCB, it was found that, "75 percent of male respondents who have considered a vocation report that they first did so when they were 18 or younger" and "One in four Catholic females who have considered becoming a religious sister did so before they were a teenager."

With this data in mind, the Diocesan Vocations Office has developed lesson plans for  $2^{nd}$  grade students that will help plant seeds of discernment and foster a culture of vocations in our Catholic schools.

The lesson plan for 2<sup>nd</sup> grade students includes Vocations Story Time – ideally, once a month, the students are read a children's book about the priesthood, religious life, married life, or prayer. The Vocations Office has compiled a list of children's books about vocations and a potential schedule to follow (*please see schedule below*). Additional activities for *after* Vocations Story Time may include practicing prayer, arts and crafts, or time for questions.
