



THE CENTER FOR **APPLIED RESEARCH IN** THE APOSTOLATE SOUGHT SURVEY **RESPONSES FROM 309 SEMINARIANS TO BE** ORDAINED IN 2025.



It received **309** responses, a response rate of **76%**. Responses came from ordinands at 115 U.S. dioceses and **36 different religious institutions**. 405 men are set to be ordained priests this year.

Conclusion: **FAMILY** and PARISH PRIESTS, alongside <u>CATHOLIC SCHOOLS</u>, provide optimal environments for a vocational call to growth.
