Liturgy of the Word

FIRST READING

Acts of the Apostles 6: 1-7b

At that time, as the number of disciples continued to grow, the Hellenists complained against the Hebrews because their widows were being neglected in the daily distribution. So the Twelve called together the community of the disciples and said, "It is not right for us to neglect the word of God to serve at table. Brothers, select from among you seven reputable men, filled with the Spirit and wisdom, whom we shall appoint to this task, whereas we shall devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word." The proposal was acceptable to the whole community, so they chose Stephen, a man filled with faith and the holy Spirit, also Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicholas of Antioch, a convert to Judaism. They presented these


men to the apostles who prayed and laid hands on them. The word of God continued to spread, and the number of the disciples in Jerusalem increased greatly; even a large group of priests were becoming obedient to the faith.

A11: Glory to you, O Lord.

GOSPEL John 12:24-26

Now there were some Greeks* among those who had come up to worship at the feast. They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and asked him, "Sir, we would like to see Jesus." Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. Jesus answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Amen, amen, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit. Whoever loves his life* loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will preserve it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there also will my servant be. The Father will honor whoever serves me. "I am troubled now. Yet what should I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? But it was for this purpose that I came to this hour. Father, glorify your name." Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it and will glorify it again." The crowd there heard it and said it was thunder; but others said, "An angel has spoken to him." Jesus answered and said, "This voice did not come for my sake but for yours. Now is the time of judgment on this world; now the ruler of this world-will be driven out. And when I am lifted up from the earth, I will draw everyone to myself." He said this indicating the kind of death he would die. "Just so, the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many."

ELECTION OF THE CANDIDATE

The Gospel of the Lord.

The candidate to be ordained to the diaconate is called forward. He goes to the Bishop before whom he makes a sign of reverence.

Deacon: Let him who is to be ordained a deacon, come forward.

Candidate: Present. Father Polednak: Most Reverend Father, holy Mother Church asks you to

ordain this man, our brother, to the responsibility of the

Diaconate.

Bishop Bambera: Do you know him to be worthy?

Father Polednak: After inquiry among the Christian people and upon the

recommendation of those responsible, I testify that he has

been found worthy.

Bishop Bambera: Relying on the help of the Lord God and our Savior Jesus

Christ, we choose him, our brother, for the Order of the

Diaconate.

All present: Thanks be to God.

PROMISE OF THE ELECT

The candidate declares his intention to be ordained to the Diaconate and to fulfill its duties.

Bishop Bambera: Dear son, before you enter the Order of the Diaconate, you

must declare before the people your intention to undertake

this office.

Bishop Bambera: Do you resolve to be consecrated for the Church's ministry

by the laying on of my hands and the gift of the Holy

Spirit?

Elect: I do.

Bishop Bambera: Do you resolve to discharge the office of Deacon with

humble charity in order to assist the priestly Order and to

benefit the Christian people?

Elect: I do.

Bishop Bambera: Do you resolve to hold fast to the mystery of faith with a

clear conscience, as the Apostle urges, and to proclaim this faith in work and deed according to the Gospel and the

Church's tradition?

Elect: I do.

Bishop Bambera: Do you resolve to keep for ever this commitment to remain

celibate as a sign of your dedication to Christ the Lord for the sake of the Kingdom of Heaven, in the service of God

and man?

Elect: I do.

Bishop Bambera: Do you resolve to maintain and deepen the spirit of prayer

that is proper to your way of life and, in keeping with this spirit and what is required of you, to celebrate faithfully the Liturgy of the Hours with and for the People of God

and indeed for the whole world?

Elect: I do.

Bishop Bambera: Do you resolve to conform your way of life always to the

example of Christ, of whose Body and Blood you are a

minister at the altar?

Elect: I do, with the help of God.

Bishop Bambera: Do you promise respect and obedience to me and my

successors?

Elect: I do.


Bishop Bambera: May God who has begun the good work in you bring it to





LAYING ON OF HANDS AND PRAYER OF ORDINATION

The Elect rises and kneels before the Bishop and the Bishop lays his hands upon the Elect's head without saying anything. With the elect kneeling before him, with hands extended, he says the Prayer of Ordination.

Please be seated.

HANDING ON OF THE BOOK OF THE GOSPELS

After the Prayer of Ordination, the newly ordained Deacon stands. The vesting clergy put a diaconal stole and then a dalmatic on the Deacon. Vested as a deacon, the newly ordained Deacon goes to the Bishop and kneels before him. The Bishop places the Book of Gospels in his hands and says:

FRATERNAL KISS

The Bishop gives the newly ordained Deacon the fraternal kiss, saying:

Deacon: And with your spirit.






Bishop Bambera: Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the

Bishop Bambera: May almighty God bless you,


